Six years ago the W.I. appointed a history committee to produce a book on the past 100 years of Tottenham. Many landmarks were disappearing, if someone didn't preserve the history it would be lost forever.

As a start the committee advertised in the newspapers asking people to send in their own family histories. This eased the workload considerably. Once the material was together it was edited by the well known author Alan Henderson.

On June 1, 1980, 3000 copies of the 463 page hard-covered book were off the press. Advanced copies were sold at cost, which eased the financial obligation. Once off the press the price now is \$17.00. The Committee are pleased with the acceptance of the book which includes many interesting photographs, facts on area pioneers and Indian life before the settlers came. Also early history of nearby communities, origin of Tottenham, the history of schools and churches and the growth of volunteer organizations and service clubs are a few of the recordings contained in the book.
