MOORE CENTRE WOMEN'S INSTITUTE HALL

An historic landmark built in 1868 now serves the Comcomity, filling a need for the Women's Institute, the Junior Farmers', and for local activities and celebrations.

In 1956, Moore Centre WI, Lambton Centre District cepted the gift of the Moore Township Hall from the Township Council with the agreement that it was to be kept repair. A legal technicality arose when the fine print read when the Council ceased to use it the land it was built on would revert to the original owner." However, through the clorts of the late David Gray, ownership papers were pointed.

Although the WI now did own the hall, as early as 1920 bey had been contributing to its upkeep. Then as now, it was the only place in the community for a meeting.

During Moore Centre's 60th Anniversary year in 1958, extensive renovations were completed with the total cost of 50,000, being paid by the WI.
