Size not to exceed 4¼" × 6½" (11 × 16 cms)

Design for front cover only

One, two or three colors acceptable. (Black and White may be used in addition)

RULES:

Name of Society

NEEDLEWORK PICTURE

THEME: MY COUNTRYSIDE

Size not to exceed 12" × 8½" (31 × 16 cms)

Theme: Picture to depict a typical scene from the countryside of the member's homeland. **TO BE MOUNTED ON STRONG CARD ONLY** — no frame or heavy backing.

Own choice of materials — no beadwork or machine stitching allowed.

RULES:

Name of Society

**Handwork to reach FWIO office no later than
Sept. 20, 1982.**

The three winning entries in each category will be chosen and will go on for final judging at FWIO office, Ottawa.

FWIO will be responsible for submitting the winning entries, and will pay for the insurance (either returning to owners or sending on for final judging.)

All entries will be displayed during the Triennial Conference and will then be available for collection before close of Conference. **Societies are requested to arrange for a delegate to be responsible for their return.**

Panels of Judges will be appointed with special knowledge. Decision final! Prizes in each of the three competitions will be:
