
Officers' Conference

The Thirty-fourth annual Conference was for PRO's at all levels and Members-at-Large. Over 550 delegates came from across the Province to participate in discussion groups and plenary sessions. A break-down indicated PRO's numbering 283 from Branches, 66 District and 7 Area delegates, along with 203 Members-at-Large assisted by 20 staff, were on hand during the three days at Waterloo.

The Conference Discussion Group activities were under the direction of the Provincial Public Relations Officer, Mrs. John Brown assisted by various members from around the Province.
