the countryside of the member's homeland. In the essay competition the theme was "My Day," not to exceed 1,000 words.

For the first time in the 50 year history of this world-wide organization, these competitions were judged outside England in Ottawa. Present for the judging was Mrs. Olive Farquharson, O.B.E., of England, former ACWW President and Competition Chairman, and the Hon. Martha P. Bielish, ACWW Area Vice-President for Canada. Seventy-two needlework and sixty-five graphic arts entries have been received from eighteen countries. These will be on display in a specially designated room at the university along with the society displays relevant to the work of the women in

these organizations and to the theme of the conference.

CHOIR

A special feature of the conference will be a choir numbering approximately 150 members of Canadian Associated Country Women of the World Constituent Societies. This choir will sing at the opening and closing ceremonies, the Interfaith Service and at two performances of "Canadiana", the National presentation of Canadian folklore and music.
