# Interview questions for oral histories

### SAMPLE INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

It should be noted that these are general questions and areas to be covered for a pioneer tape, and are a guide only. Remember to always ask the "who, what, when, where and why" of situations.

#### Personal History:

- 1. Where and when they were born.
- When did they arrive in Canada? How? (route taken and type of transportation)

Why did they choose Canada?

- 3. Where did they first settle? How did they travel from port of entry to place of settlement? Problems encountered on the journey.
- 4. Where did they settle in Ontario? Why did they settle there? How did they acquire land? How did they make their living?

- 1. Type of farming
  - plowing techniques
  - how they got seed (grain)
  - type of livestock
  - food storage
- 2. Survey Gangs

- 6. Holidays: Christmas, July 1st, Orange Day etc.
