Ways to wear your W.I. scarf

Many Women's Institute members have purchased the new oblong scarf originally intended to help identify the Ontario delegates at the 1985 FWIC National Convention. But, because the scarf is so versatile, many of you are wearing it now to show off the WI connection. Rural Organization Specialist Bonnie Wilson from Elgin County compiled information on ways to wear the new scarves and presented it to London Area Convention delegates. Here is that information for the other scarf-wearers across the province.

SQUARE KNOT

Place the tie around your neck with one end slightly longer than the other. Tie longer end over shorter end. Hold short end, and make a loop by bringing the long end around hand.

Place longer end through loop and tighten.



SIDE LOOP (an easy one!)

Fold scarf in half and place it around your neck. Place the ends through the loop and pull in the opposite direction until loop is comfortably snug.



SIDE FLIP

Place scarf around your neck leaving one end longer than the other. Knot. Take the longer end and pull up and through, going between the scarf and your neck.

Turn to the side and fluff.



THE SOFT BOW

Place scarf around neck teeping both ends even. Grasp scart in both sides in the middle of the sc. of or inner edges and pull through a large ring.

Fluff "bows" and straig en the ends to hang nicely.
