President's Report Mrs. Charlotte Johnson

Mrs. Johnson announced a new branch was organized in North Renfrew District on January 15, 1985 — Greenwood Branch.

In February, Mrs. Johnson attended a seminar in Toronto on pornography, sponsored by Canadians for Decency. The speakers outlined the four stages of pornography that affect those who watch it — addiction; escalation; de-sensitization; finally acting out. They stressed we should talk to children about what is appropriate and remember we have to compete with what is available at the corner store and we must have the courage to care.

Branches are to be commended for their efforts in promoting the FWIC Past Presidents' Essay Competition. One hundred and thirty Ontario children submitted essays on My Dream of Peace or Water for a Thirsty World. These were judged and the five winning entries have been forwarded to the FWIC Office in Ottawa.

On February 5, FWIO MacDonald Awards valued at \$200 each were presented to Laura O'Brien, Wanda Elmhirst and Lynne Holley who are enrolled in the College of Family and Consumer Studies at the University of Guelph. In 1985, there are 15 Awards available — each valued at \$300.

As we are well into International Youth Year, Mrs. Johnson hopes you are developing programs and activities that will involve you working with young people.

Over 100 letters have been sent to eligible Federation Representatives in the districts where new provincial board directors must be elected.

Replies were received to several letters sent out about the resolution pertaining to retail stores being open for seven days a week. This is definitely a local law and concerns should be directed to the municipality involved.

Mrs. Johnston answered all letters requesting information, spoke to many groups on special occasions and always promoted the Women's Institute.

#### Treasurer's Report Mrs. Elaine Williams

Mrs. Williams presented the interim financial report for the period October 1, 1984 to March 31, 1985 and outlined the proposed budget for October 1, 1985 to September 30, 1986.

Recommendations carried were: — that the mileage rate be 17¢ per kilometer commencing October, 1985

- that a \$3 error on fee sheets be accepted as received
- that no expense account be submitted under \$5
- that FWIO fees will increase from \$1 to \$2 for 1986
- that FWIO purchase a cheque protector

Thus far, FWIO has raised \$32,656 for the Clean Water and Sanitation project. Mrs. Johnson will make the presentation to FWIC at the National Convention in June at London, Ontario.

### FWIC Report Mrs. Bernice Noblitt

Mrs. Noblitt stressed "the need for branches to be more aware of what is going on in other parts of their own areas, at their provincial level, and certainly at FWIC level".

Adelaide Hoodless Fund donations show a total of approximately \$65,000
