
14-day bus tour planned

OFA had a busy year

FWIO has an organizational membership with the Ontario Federation of Agriculture. The following report follows the OFA's annual meeting.

In order to streamline the reporting procedures, it was recommended that all county federations and the provincial federation have a common fiscal year, using the new data system that has been installed at the OFA offices.

County federations met with local municipal councils. The finding was that most municipal councils near large centres are represented by a majority of urban people. The result is that many such councils are critical of agricultural policies. Because agriculture is so diversified and complex, it is hard for the OFA to present just one issue to government. On the other hand, several issues at a time tend to get bogged down.

Northwestern Ontario Rural Women's Self Help Group was awarded a \$10,000 grant from Ministry of Community & Social Services which will be administered by OFA. The purpose of this group is to identify and train local women who, as community leaders will identify and respond to local concerns about family violence with an educational focus on the development of self help groups of rural women.

Apparently, most teachers are not aware of the Helpful Teaching Resources book provided by the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food, even though it was sent to all Ontario schools.

Most of the Counties took part in promoting Agri Food Week by means of mall demonstrations, farm tours and visiting schools.

the previous winner who has completed her course.

A new account was opened in the name of "Mrs. Alfred Watt Memorial Fund" with donations received from ACWW Conference (\$19,195.75). The interest from this account to be used to send voting representatives to the ACWW Council meetings and conferences.
