How to invite a guest speaker

Hilde G. Morden of Rodney, Ontario was prompted to send us the following tips about how to invite a guest speaker after recalling some of her own humorous, and sometimes frustrating, experiences on the speaker's podium! · give at least one month's notice

 follow up with a letter, asking if speaker needs podium, flip chart, overhead, projector, screen, etc.

The speaker is your guest. She/he wants to do the very best presentation

to fill your request. This will take time, effort and all the help you can provide. The more details you give your speaker about the group, theme and meeting place, the more successful the presentation will be.

HOW TO INVITE A SPEAKER

- identify yourself and your organization
- if someone recommended the speaker, tell him/her
- give a topic, theme or explain it's the speaker's choice
- · give date, time and place
- explain the type of meeting, number of people, kinds of people (e.g. women, men or children, age group)
- · length of speech
- · when on the program
- ask if there is a fee or travel expenses
- request a biographical sketch of speaker — for the introduction
