Chances are you'll need a bit of extra money if you want to attend the Associated Country Women of the World (ACWW) conference in Killyarnney, Ireland in May.

Theme of the 18th triennial ACWW conference is 'Focus on the Family', providing a forum for plenty of discussion, work and involvement. There should also be some time out during the eight-day conference to see the famous Irish countryside at its Spring-time best.

The conference begins with registration and area meetings on May 20, followed by a launching party and opening ceremony on May 21. The

closing ceremonies will take place on May 27. The conference will take place at the Great Southern Hotel.

The registration fee is 30 pounds (Sterling) and the conference fee, which covers such items as renting of venues, shuttle buses, the staging of exhibitions, etc. is 90 pounds (Irish). Both fees are non-refundable.

The FWIO is sending five voting delegates and one non-voting delegate to the ACWW conference, which will be attended by representatives of over 60 countries.

Other WI members may attend the conference at their own expense, provided they have belonged to ACWW for at least three years.

Pre and post conference tours are being arranged too through Vellinga Travel Service, Box 234, Chatham, Ontario N7M 5K3.
