It all began when Rosemary Marshall showed our members a film called Breakthrough. The film featured her son Paul and portrayed what he and other victims of cerebral palsy are able to do despite their problems. Paul is very active and intelligent, but his illness prevents him from using the faculty of speech.

We learned how Paul might be able to do more with a voice synthesizer. The speech prosthesis communicator device is a voice computer which uses microelectronics to synthesize the human voice. It is nine by 15 inches, with a keyboard on which Paul may type out words. The computer will interpret what he has typed and then express it verbally.

The Woodburn WI hoped to raise \$3,400 — the cost of a synthesizer.

To that end, a cookbook of favorite recipes was put together and sold, and members catered to many weddings and banquets.

Our hopes were realized last May when we were able to present Paul with his own synthesizer, programmed to his specific needs.

Paul is now attending Mohawk College in Hamilton.
