

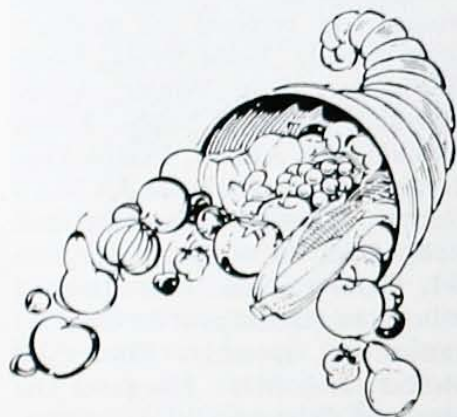
Educational Award
