Agricultural concerns addressed by FWIO board directors

Meeting the needs and concerns of all farm and rural women was the focus of the March Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario (FWIO) Board meeting.

FWIO has signed an agreement with Barbara Klages and Maxine Innes-Holbrough for a two-year pilot project to offer life skill courses. For the first year, the courses will be breadmaking and landscaping your home.

These courses will operate in a similar fashion as the former Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food courses, with two leaders attending an adult training school and then bringing back the information via a series of workshops to the local branches. These workshops will require a fee and will be open to all groups. Ask your board director for the complete details.

Agriculture and the concerns of the farming community appeared in 10 different topic items on the agenda. This included a report from the Agriculture Advisory Committee of Hilde Morden, Janet Parsons, Gail Murdock and Joyce Anderson. Topics such as the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) and the affects of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) on the farm community were all discussed.

In response to numerous requests, from all across Canada, for lists of the published Tweedsmuir History Books, all districts have been asked to check not only the published Tweedsmuir History Books, but also those that have been microfilmed, the whereabouts of the Tweedsmuir Books of disbanded branches, and those used as the basis for other history books.

Women from across Ontario are responding to the Federated Women's Institute of Canada (FWIC) questionnaire on rural child care. The results will appear in a future issue of Home & Country.

The Centennial Committee announced the Centennial Logo will be presented to the August 1990 FWIO Board Meeting. A Memento Committee would be set up to give guidance to those wanting to use the logo on saleable items.

Margaret Munro will be the FWIO return exchangee to Nebraska. When she returns, Margaret will prepare a slide set and taped commentary to be used for branch meetings.
