Goulds WI

Goulds WI (London Area) was founded on May 14, 1919 and, 92 years later, they continue to be an active Branch in Perth South District. Today, the Branch is comprised of 15 Members who live in the Staffa, Mitchell and Stratford areas. Four of their Members are Honorary Life Members.

Over the years, Goulds WI has made many contributions to their community. In 1922, they purchased a piano for the Goulds' School as well as furniture for the restrooms in Mitchell. They have catered for the International Ploughing Match and the Mitchell Fair. The Branch has sponsored 4-H clubs since 1952, and one Member has led 4-H for 30 years. In 1947, they started their Tweedsmuir History Books, and their local Archivist has stated that she and many others have used these records a great deal.

The Branch keeps busy working on WI leadership tasks at the District, Area and Provincial levels; Fall Fair activities and displays in Mitchell and Stratford; 4-H leadership; crafts; making clothes for children at the Children's Hospital of Western Ontario in London; visiting ill friends; and canvassing for many charities. Members all pitch in and help whenever they have a project. They have hosted several ROSE Sessions for their community, with most of their speakers being local persons. A 50-50 draw at each meeting helps with extra funding.

The Branch emphasizes that the key to their success is being a friendly and outgoing group. They have fun and enjoy each other's company, taking part in what they are asked to do and helping others when they have concerns. Most of all, they are proud to be Members of WI - for Home and Country.
