As many Branch meetings begin, Branch President, Marg Opthof, opened the June meeting of Sunny Brooke WI (Southwestern Area) with the Ode and Mary Stewart Collect. But this was not your typical meeting - it was a step back in time. The theme for this meeting was, "Tweedsmuir: 100 Years Ago". Thirteen Members and one visitor answered the Roll Call with an activity from Grandma's WI meeting in 1910. Stephanie Cattrysse from the Watford Guide came in and took pictures of Members dressed as they would have for a WI meeting in 1910. Tweedsmuir History Curators showed several antiques that Members brought and had the ladies guess what some were used for. Doreen Pitel showed history albums of Lambton County, Members' farms and of Shetland Women's Institute. Doreen also spoke about her grandmother's memories of the Women's Institute of 1910 and 1911.
