(then known as S.S. Public School #9), Union Street WI later became instrumental in petitioning to keep it as a community centre after it closed in the 1960's and faced being torn down.

Celebrations went on all day and a timeline from 1914 to 2014 and artifacts were displayed inside the hall where over 160 people visited. Union Street WI Member, Shirley Deavitt, was in attendance and was also one of the first Members to sit on the board in 1967 after the school was

closed. The little hall is busy and Union Street WI Members still meet once a month and also help with many functions.
