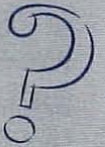
Despite inclement weather 14 women armed with rolling pins and pastry blenders attended "A Meal in a Shell" ROSE Session.

What is a Blog?

Blog is short for weblog. A weblog is a journal (or newsletter) that is available on the Internet. They are frequently updated and intended for general public consumption. They usually include philosophical reflections, opinions on the Internet and social or political issues.

The activity of updating a blog is "blogging" and someone who keeps a blog is a "blogger." Blogs are typically updated daily using software that allows people with little or no technical background to update and maintain the blog.

A weblog or Internet diary. Weblogs enable users to publish short comments and ideas instantly for other people to read. Blogging can be an effective communications tool for small groups of people to keep in touch with each other.

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
