Senator Cairine Wilson Competition

The Senator Cairine Wilson Silver Rose Bowl Trophy is presented at the Federated Women's Institutes of Canada (FWIC) Convention each triennium. The award began in 1957 when Senator Wilson presented it for the most outstanding Women's Institute project in Citizenship.

The Competition for the 2003 to 2006 triennium continues in the celebration of women and their contribution to the rural fabric of Canada. The Competition entails writing about our own Women's Institute members who demonstrate the qualities outlined in the Mary Stewart Collect and who have contributed to the development of a Branch or Branches. It may be someone who started your Branch

and/or keeps members motivated to keep learning and to support their community.

Indeed, there are hundreds of members who meet this criterion and could have their contribution acknowledged and celebrated. This Competition is open to individual Women's Institute members.

Format

- The information can be in the form of a story or a poem.
- The story should be a minimum of 800 words.
- The poem should be a minimum of 8 lines and does not have to rhyme.

Presentation

- The story and the poem must be typed and presented on 8 1/2 x 11 inch white paper.

- The entrant's name, address, phone number and Branch should be enclosed in a sealed envelope securely fastened on a separate piece of paper and attached to the story or poem.
