Changes re: Home & Country - Members Take Note



A t Area Conventions last fall, FWIO President Dianne Orr announced several changes. One of these changes was the reduction in the number of *Home & Country* newsletters printed each year. This, of course, impacts on the content. Consequently, the FWIO Board passed the following recommendations at their November 2003 meeting in regard to the *Home & Country* and its content.

- That three issues of the Home & Country newsletter be produced each year, with approximate distribution times of late January, May and September (a distribution every 4 months).
- That Coordinator's columns per say be eliminated from the newsletter, and be replaced with more succinct news from the provincial level, with the exception of the two-page spread of programming ideas in the Winter issue.
- That reports from Coordinators, the FWIO Executive Officer to FWIC and the International Coordinator be distributed via Branch mailings (to begin in the 2004-2005 fiscal year) or as inserts in the Home & Country, with the cost of an insert being billed to their budgets
- That 100th anniversary reports only be listed in the Congratulations Column and members be encouraged to promote these momentous occasions in their local papers.
- That the Home & Country increase the number of pages filled with Branch, District and Area activity reports to approximately 60 to 70 per cent, with the remaining space being given to provincial level news and reports.

Re: the change in the distribution:

The reasoning behind the distribution of the newsletters every 4 months is as follows. The January issue could still cover the two-page spread of Branch programming ideas and still arrive in time for Branch planning; the May issue would arrive in time with provincial level news that would reach members prior to the summer holidays when many Branches do not meet; and the September issue would arrive when Branches are beginning their new year of programs.

Re: the change in the content:

Obviously something has to go in terms of content. With four issues, there was always carry over from one issue to the next in terms of Branch, District and Area activity reports; this will be compounded with only three newsletters being produced.


The Home & Country is the primary communications tool between the provincial and Branch level of the organization. So, it is critical to maintain articles that reflect this, or at the very least change the format of this information so it better fits the space. Consequently, with respect to provincial level news, the following items will be maintained in the newsletter in a synthesized format:

- · the President's Message
- · the ROSE Program Manager's Column
- · information re: membership recruitment
- · information re: current resolutions
- · information from Board

Beginning with the 2004-2005 fiscal year, there will be four Branch mailings each year. Much of the information being removed from the *Home & Country* will be distributed via the Branch mailings beginning with the new fiscal year October 1, 2004.

So the information will still get down to the Branch level, it will just be a different mode of delivery!
