Reduce Unsolicited Junk Mail

Most Canadians are annoyed by unsolicited phone calls. Did you know that you can reduce your chances of getting these kinds of calls? The

Canadian Marketing Association (CMA) has set up a Do Not Mail/Do Not Call Service. It allows people to have their names removed from lists held by CMA members. Almost eight out of ten companies that market directly to Canadians by phone are registered with the CMA.

To get your name taken off the marketing lists, you

must write to CMA at 1 Concorde Gate, Suite 607, Don Mills ON M3C 3N6. Give your name and address and all the spellings of your name that might be used. It takes about 3 months before you will notice a change. The removal lasts for three years.
