What is a ROSE Session?

Under the mandate of the "ROSES are Blooming" Expansion Project, a ROSE (rural ontario sharing education) Session includes any educational session where the community is invited to participate. However, a ROSE Session would not include a Branch Program where only Branch members are in attendance. ROSE Sessions include almost all topics - including crafts and health and community service initiatives - so long as you invite the community to attend and there is an educational component. ROSE Sessions can come in many forms, including health fairs, guest speakers and community workshops and presentations.
