The Salem-Nilestown Women's Institute has rewritten history. The Branch has just completed a history of the area for the second time.

The Institute's first Tweedsmuir History Book was stolen out of a member's car four years ago as she was delivering it to get a microfilm copy made. It was a great blow to the group, who had spent countless hours compiling the chronicle. Because the Tweedsmuir volume was stored in a box from the LCBO, the thief thought they were stealing a box of liquor; instead, they made off with irreplaceable pictures donated to the cause.

Members say it took them awhile to get over the shock of their loss, and even longer to think about tackling the project again.

So it is with great pride that the group shows a visitor the fruits of their labour. The attractive book illustrates the history of the Institute, which began out of the Salem Methodist Church in 1916. Eleven years later it became the Salem-Nilestown Women's Institute.


The Salem-Nilestown Women's Institute will make sure this written history is not lost again. It has all been saved on a computer disk that will be carefully locked away.


