have been a member of the Women's Institute for many years. Branch members participated in many other fund raising activities in their efforts to improve our WI Hall.

With the encouragement of Donna Healey of Healey Tours in Smiths Falls, I started my own travel agency and arranged and accompanied tour groups throughout Canada and the United States. Once I obtained my license, my tours were extended

to include the British Isles, many European countries, Australia, New Zealand, Israel, as well as Mediterranean, Carribean and other island cruises.
