
Will we have all the pieces?

Did you know?

When you pay your \$15 membership fee to the Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario (FWIO), you automatically become a member of the Federated Women's Institutes of Canada (FWIC) and the Associated Country Women of the World (ACWW). This entitles you to wear all three badges. Remember, Branches must pay all three fees for each of their members - \$15 to FWIO, \$2 to FWIC and \$0.25 to ACWW - whether individuals pay the full amount or whether the Branch subsidizes them through fundraising efforts.
