All Branches are encouraged to participate fully in each of the following three categories;

### **Community History Competition**

- a wall hanging depicting the history of your community

#### **Project Regulations:**

- open to individual Women's Institute members or a WI Branch
- · to be made from material of your choice
- approximate size to be 36" long x 23" wide
- a wooden dowel to be placed at the top for display purposes
- give a short written description of the wall hanging - approximately 250 to 300 words
- descriptions to be typed on one page, double spaced and placed in a plastic page protector
- name and address of the entrant to be enclosed in a sealed envelope attached to the back of the project

a) General Appearance	30
b) Suitability of Materials	15
c) Workmanship	30
d) Written History	25

### **Handicraft Competition**

- counted cross-stitch Christmas tree skirt

## **Project Regulations:**

- · can be an individual WI or Branch effort
- · approximate size to be 45" in diameter
- · not a kit
- name and address of the entrant to be enclosed in a sealed envelope attached to the back of the project

a) General Appearance	15
b) Originality	25
c) Finishing	15
d) Suitability of Materials	15
e) Workmanship	30

### **Cultural Competition**

- short story: "My Memories of a One-Room Schoolhouse"

#### **Project Regulations:**

- using the theme, "My Memories of a One-Room Schoolhouse," the short story must be written by an individual WI member
- not to consist of more than two memories

- to consist of a minimum of 750 words or a maximum of 1000 words
- to be typed and double spaced in a book form, with a cover depicting the one-room schoolhouse
- to include one or two illustrations throughout
- name and address of the entrant to be enclosed in a sealed envelope attached to a blank back page

#### Points:

a) Cover	20
b) Story Content	20
c) Diction	20
d) Illustrations	20
e) Characterization	20
Total Points	100
