

Their patterns are multi-sized, and many are unisex. They design "one-of-a-kind" garments in two complete clothing collections each year - one for spring/summer and the other for fall/winter.

From my franchise in Frankford, I offer a wide variety of sewing classes. I have been trained as a MacPhee Workshop Instructor. As well, I am addicted to sewing and enjoy showing sewers the many shortcuts and tips on how to make garments with ease and flare. I have personally assisted Linda MacPhee at many shows and seminars throughout Canada and the United States.
