Skits and poems are a specialty of hers, which she composes in the early hours of the morning. Her hobbies include knitting, plastic canvas weaving and cake decorating. Being a wife of a Hereford cattle breeder, she prepares many quick meals and coffee breaks for visitors and buyers.

Every fall for several years, Norma judged the Home Craft Division of many Ontario fairs. She has served on the Ladies Division of the Peterborough Fair Board and has helped with the Cancer Society. Now, she belongs to the local Hospital Visitation Group. Her summer months are spent at the cottage.
