In 1897 the first Women's Institute was formed in Stoney Creek, Ontario. Dedicated to improving conditions for rural women in the home and community through education, the Women's Institute rapidly grew from a single Branch in Ontario to a national and international organization.

Linda Ambrose, Assistant Professor of History at Laurentian University, has carefully documented the growth of the organization and the activities of the members in their communities.

This fascinating history, based on extensive research in provincial records, includes personal anecdotes from oral history interviews and more than 125 illustrations, many of which are previously unpublished photographs.

This book is an important contribution to both rural women's history and Ontario history in addition to being a celebration of the Women's Institute centennial.
