

Fifteen bags of garbage and recyclable items were picked up from the ditches during the first clean-up. Two additional clean-ups have taken place. The Carry-On WI felt that this was one way to contribute to the betterment of the community and the environment, and at the same time develop good public relations. Signs were erected at both entrances to White's Road. Money received from returnable cans and bottles was donated to Pennies for Friendship.
