Since 1995 marks the 50th anniversary of the end of World War II, during which time the Coliseum, the Cattle Barns and the Horse Palace provided a 'home away from home' for young men and women in all branches of the Armed Services. The Planning Committee is preparing a program to focus on the War Years and the use of those buildings. There will be special memorabilia, music of the '40s and recollections by those connected with life at the Exhibition Military Camp during those years.

- Admission to the RAWF, the Horse Show for the Opening Night Performance, and the Luncheon is \$55.

The Planning Committee asks for your support. Cafe Royale can accommodate only 200 people, and to succeed, we need to fill those places. The program will appeal to both men and women, and we hope you will promote bus groups from your community, as well as from your members. Seats at the Royal Horse Show will be scattered along the end and sides of the Coliseum Arena, so there should be no obstruction due to posts.

It was a unique time and one to which rural Ontario made its own special contribution.
