Mansfield WI



The members of this Branch voted to donate \$500 to the cause, as well as to search their attics and basements for artifacts that may be of interest to the Museum.

The sum of ten cents was paid to have a name stitched on a block. In 1944, the quilt was raffled and Joy (Smith) Wilkin became its proud owner. In 1992, Mrs. Wilkin returned the quilt to the White School Branch who decided to turn it over to the Bruce County Museum in Southhampton for safe-keeping and future reference.

Halton District WI

The Halton District Women's Institute was responsible for catering coffee and muffins at the "Country Quilt Fest" last year at the Ontario Agricultural Museum in Milton.

Brant and Norfolk Districts WI

The Districts in Brant and Norfolk Counties decided to join forces and conduct short courses. The response was overwhelming to the topic chosen - "Easy No-Sew Christmas Decorations." Flyers were distributed to the general public and at the fall fair. Five different locations and dates were sold out with class sizes of 30 each time. Participants received a manual and the materials to make at least five different decorations in the all-day event. Skilled WI members instructed. Cardecorating was chosen as the topic for the Spring '94 Short Course.
