Jean Hughes of Lucknow

Jean Hughes was born in 1892 in the St. Helen's district of Huron County. She graduated as a nurse from Victoria Hospital in London in 1917. She has many courageous tales to tell about her experiences caring for the sick in High River, Alberta, and later in Kinloss Township in Bruce County.

Jean married Allister Hughes in 1922. They farmed until 1973, when they retired to Wingham, and then Lucknow. Jean was a charter member of the Kairshea Women's Institute in 1947. She was presented with a life membership in the Kinloss-Kairshea WI in 1991. The following extracts from a poem - written for her 50th wedding anniversary - conveys something of how Jean's community still feels about her.

As a nurse o'er the years, when life was so rough, She worked with the sick, and proved she was tough. As she stood by the stove, heating blankets galore, To wrap 'round her patient, as the fever would soar.

For hours and hours, they say Jean would stand, To aid or to comfort, with a touch of her hand. There would be times she'd just wait and sit, I bet that was when she learned how to knit.
