Miss Bertha Kilborn, Miss Mildred Kilborn,
Miss Myrtle McFadden, Misses May and Alma
Hales were all registered nurses. Miss
Alma Hales was matron of Pembroke Hospital.
Miss Annie McFadden went to Bermuda Island
as captain on the Salvation Army and
carried on missionary work among the
negroes. She married while there and
still resides in Bermuda.
Duncan Brown was reeve of Burleigh Twp.
for a number of years.

The boys who attended this school and gave their services in the World War No. 1 were: Herman Harris, John McFadden, Bert McIlmoyl, Zedock Hales, John Coones, Roy Coones, Tom Coones(killed), Wilbert Lean(killed) and Wm. Hales(should be Russell).

Mr. John Lean was secretary of the School Board and probably was the first secretary of the section. He was succeeded by his younger brother, Mr. Isaac Lean who held this office for some forty or fifty years. Mr. Lean died in 1939 at the age of 93 years.

In 1925 consolidation of schools in the Apsley area was attempted and Mr. Roy Brown of Apsley acted as secretary.

In 1927 consolidation dissolved and Mr. Wellington Lean was appointed secretary for this section and received the books on January 1, 1928.

In 1926 the school term was extended to ten months of the year - September to June.

The attendance in the year 1931-2 was three pupils.

This was the lowest attendance recorded in the school history.

During this year there were three teachers engaged - Miss

May Pollock, Miss Helen Troupe and Miss Marjory Purdy.
