In 1933 Highway No. 28 was constructed from Young's Point to Apsley and the road past the school was straightened and so moved away from the school site. In the summer of 1935 the school was moved to lot 18, concession 12, on the highway at a total cost of \$225.00. This one-acre of land was bought from Mr. Duncan Brown at a cost of \$70.00. New out-buildings were built at the same time at a cost of \$31.00. The old school site was handed back to Mr. Bert McIlmoyl, grandson of the orginal owner. During the fall of this same year a wire fence was built around the school yard on three sides.

The Red Cross Outpost Hospital was bought and remodelled in Apsley in 1927 and Red Cross health supervision was organized in the school. The Red Cross nurse makes two annual visits to the school - one in the spring and one in the fall of each year.

Hot lunches were started in the school in 1925. Later when household science was taught a table and cupboard were made by Mr. John McColl and added to the equipment of the school. The first household science grant received from the Department was in 1931.

In 1931 the study of Agriculture was introduced into the school and in 1933 a school garden was planted and cared for. Then the school was moved to its new location, the school gardens were discontinued, but Agriculture was still taught.

Music was begun in the school in 1935 with Mrs. George Kilborn as the special music teacher. Music was discontinued
