

A prize, donated by Mr. Gordon K. Fraser, was given to the school in January. The prize was a book entitled "Famous Composers" and was won by the school as a result of a contest held the year before by Mrs. George Kilborn for all the schools in which she taught music. Each school made a Music Scrap Book and when these were judged by Mr. McKinney of the Peterborough Normal School, this school won first prize.

Religious instruction, which was discontinued the previous May, was begun again in February by Rev. Mr. Freeston of Apsley. Mr. Freeston donated some story books to the library in March.

A quilt was begun by the pupils for the Junior Red Cross, but was not completed.

Stanley Harris obtained his entrance standing at Easter 1943, in order to do farm work.

The fall term in 1943 did not open until September 7 as no teacher was available at the first of the month. Mrs. N. Wilson then came as teacher. There were only 5 pupils on the roll and when Donald Earnshaw went to another section for the winter months there were just 4 on the roll. After Easter Glen Earnshaw began school and Donald returned making 6 pupils.

Rev. Mr. F. Freeston of Apsley taught religious instruction in the school and Mrs. Geo. Kilborn taught music.
