Mrs. Kilborn was present to accompany in the musical numbers.

In April 20th, 21st, 1938, Douglas Dunford and Everett Bolton attended the O.E.A. They were a part of the group taken to Toronto by Mr. G. Kilborn.

On June 29, 1938, the annual school picnic was held.

The Annual School Fair was held on September 10th, 1938.

This school carried off all the awards; 1st, Everett Bolton, 2nd,

Douglas Dunford, 3rd, Irene Stone.

On December 22, the Annual School Concert was held with Mr. N. Bolton as chairman. A very delightful time was had by all; Mrs. Kilborn, Music Supervisor assisted with the music.
