spirit.

St. George's had another face-lift with the renovations in the narthex. The walls were sanded and revarnished, a new main door and window were installed and new carpet laid. Two comfortable chairs were placed at the rear of the church for the use of handicapped persons.

A first in the history of the parish can be claimed by the present parishioners. During the past four years no Diocesan financial assistance has been received. This accomplishment is due partly to the presence of our layminister only half time.

Somehow, our early history missed the Rev. F. H. Hartley. He first appears as a deacon in 1892 during the time of Rev. Philip Harding. He became priest in 1893. His signature appears until 1894 when it is believed he went to help found the Parish of Stoney Lake.

This marks an end and a beginning. We come to the close of our 110th year, but the beginning of more history to be written in the coming years. "To God be the glory, great things He hath done" and will continue to do as we move forward ever seeking to do His will.
