Nov. 22, 1922

Jenny Miller Williamson born in Arkwright was a daughter of Sarah Woodside Miller.

Woodside farm was later called Black Farm

Mother had 6 little boys she started teaching when her husband lost the Black Farm. She went to Toronto Normal School. The boys went to Mansel to their Grandmother Hartley Craig

"Mother came back to Arkwright to teach. Old Jack Faulkner and his wife got Jack, Tom and I at Granny Craig and drove home by sleigh by way of Owen Sound.

Two yrs. later mother took another course Kenning, Tappin, Warko and Hearst took the two boys.

"I" (Who?) received nothing but kind treatment from the Hearsts.

Jennie & Mary Hearst lived in Tara.
