## May 1, 1885

Perth Courier reported a number of pallbearers smoking clay pipes which was a novel feature in a funeral procession as it made its melancholy way through the town.

Maple Home, cheese factory in the village had opened for the season.

No K & P passenger trains had moved to or from Renfrew during the past week. There had been a washout between Flower and Mississippi. One report said two miles of track was washed away.

Duncan Ferguson had taken agency for, Thymocresol, which was described as a "universal purifier." It also was good as a detergent, disinfectant, deodorizer, antiseptic and insecticide. It was useful for dressing wounds, cleaning premises of offensive smells, clearing out rats, mice and other vermin and for the destruction of insects.

## May 6, 1910

Liquor side had appealed a local option by-law but courts in Toronto sustained the law. The liquor side had to pay the costs. One hundred and sixteen dogs had been tagged and Town Clerk J K Rochester expected the number would go to 150.

P D Stewart advertised Massey-Harris mowers, rakes, with automatic dump, hay loaders, side delivery rakes and hay tenders.

Union SS No 4 McNab and No 10 Horton advertised for a teacher. Salary was \$450 per annum.

The scenery used at Temperance Hall was advertised for sale. It was comparatively new.

K & P trains made connections with CPR trains at Sharbot Lake, and with Bay of Quinte trains at Harrowsmith.
