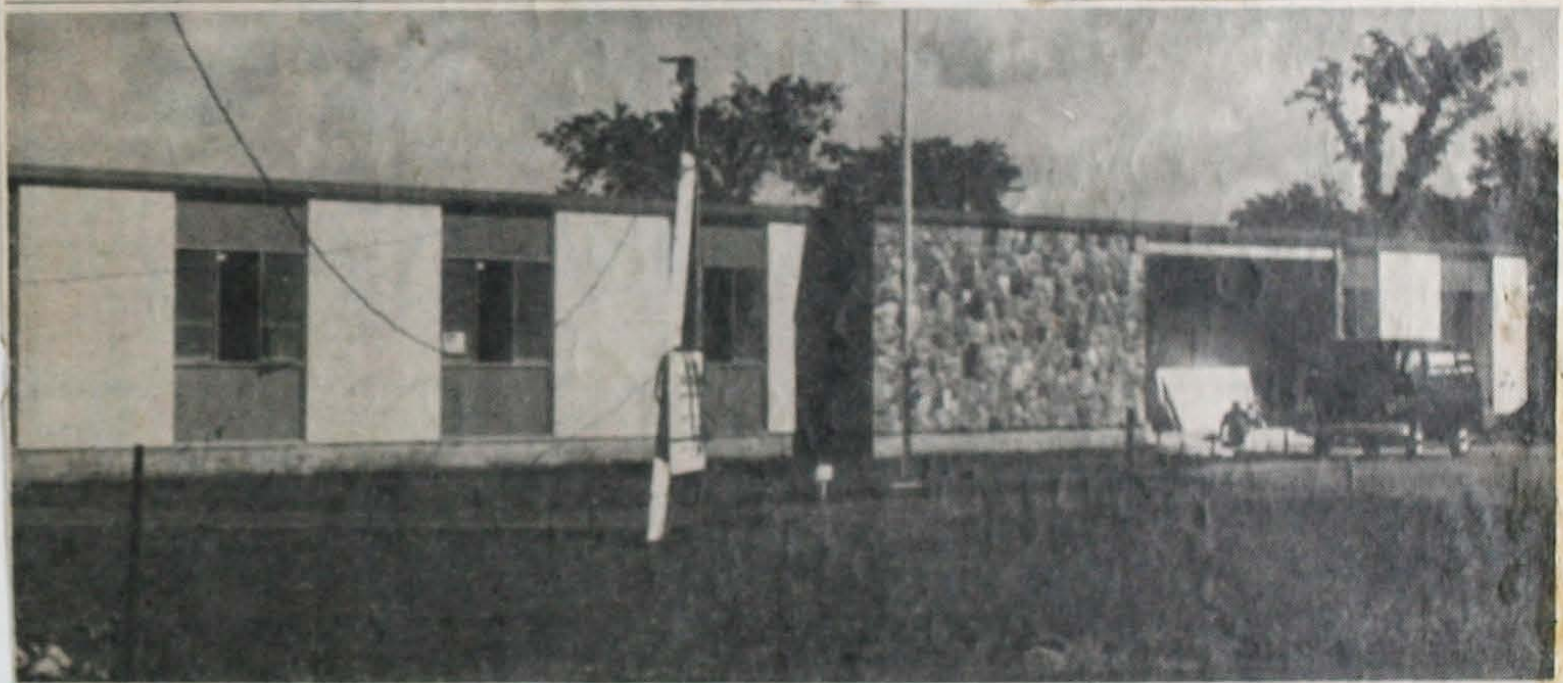


7-room central school opens

The day of the one room school in Admaston Township is past, Tuesday morning, 211 public school pupils started at the new seven room central public school on County Road 5 near the intersection of highway 132. Pupils will be transported by Renfrew County Bus Lines and by Gordon Holmes from all parts of Admaston Township and the parts of Horton and Bagot Townships which are included in the Admaston Public School Area.
