Mrs. Adelaide Hunter Hoodless was born on the homestead near St. George, Ontario

She founded the Women's Institute of Ontario; organizing the first institute at Stoney Cree, Ontario, on February 17th, 1897.

The Homestead was made an Historic Site at an unveiling ceremony on June 13th, 1959.

Mrs. Hoodless was cited as a National Figure at an impressive unveiling of a plaque in her honour at the Homestead on June 2nd, 1962, by the National Historic Site Board.
