- 1971- MAY- Belmont and Methuen Fire Department joined in with Havelock Fire Dept.
- 1971- County of Feterborough purchased land in the nineth concession of Belmont township. This land formerly owned by the late Mr. Charles Davidson, who purchased it in the early nineteen hundreds.

 The County burned down the ancient log house, the building location was landscaped leaving a portion untouched where the graves of two children had been buried in the eighteen hundreds. Acounty garage was built now housing the County Road Equipment.
- 1972- SEPT- The new postal code system was introduced by M.A.F.F. (Major Area Fostal Flants) Program NOL 120.
- 1974- JUNE- 10th, Havelock, Belmont and Methuen Community Medical Centre opened.

 Dr. Eric mendum was the first doctor to occupy office there.
- 1974- JULY-Old Bridge Crashed. A bridge over Deer River in the Van Sickle settlement, made many years ago of logs and wooden timbers was crashed through by a heavy truck load of logs. Feeple and food supplies were taken back and forth by canoes and small motor boats owned by nearby residents until a new bridge of steel construction, was built in the same spot replacing the old one.
- 1977- MAY- Havelock, Belmont and methuen Senior Citizens Apartments officially opened. The Belmont Women's Institute catered refreshments for the occasion.
- 1978- Mr. John ward moved his welding business from the west end of Havelock to Belmont Township, approximately ½ mile north of Havelock. A new Shopping Plaza is being built on and near the premises he vacated.
- 1978- Reeve Elwood Hamilton and Council arranged for a new kitchen and washrooms built adjacent to the Township Hall and Women's Institute Rooms.
- 1979-"Was Year of the Child", and Mrs. Irene Magill R.R.#4, Havelock, won the Canadian Awards for a song she wrote, "Children are the Future".
- 1980- Belmont Women's Institute celebrated it 65th Anniversary. The President Mrs. Clarence Pollock, held a special celebration in the Belmont and Methuen Community Centre, where Mr. John Embleton, catered the banquet for approximately 140 guests.
- 1981- A Communication Kelay Station was built in Methuen Township after much survey and general view showed this location to be the highest point of land between Toronto Airport and Montreal.
- 1981- A Postal Strike
- 1981- A successful Arts and Craft show was held in the Havelock Belmont and Methuen Community Centre in July.
- 1981-OCTOBER-18th, Post Office became a Crown Corporation and no longer with the
