HAVELOCK, April 23.—The Belmont Women's Institute April meeting was held in the township hall on Thursday afternoon last, and considering the house-cleaning season was well attended. The president, Mrs. Robert Anderson, occupied the chair.

After the opening ode, the members bowed their heads in silence for two minutes, a tribute to the memory of the late Mrs. J. A. Sexsmith, a beloved former member, and for many years president of the branch.
