Old Preneveau School Being Demolished 1960

One of the first public schools built in Belmont Township—the brick school at Preneveau — a township landmark is being demolished. It was closed as a school in 1905, after at least two generations of children had received their education within its walls. The most illustrious pupil who received his education there was John A. Sexsmith. He was member of Parliament for the riding of East Peterborough, serving for many years.

The school has been in a sad state of disrepair for many years and was considered to be a menace to the safety of children playing there, and to highway safety.

At the time the school was built in 1878, No. 7 highway was not even a dream of the future. At that time the road was locally known as the Norwood road and was a far cry from the present highway.

The Belmont and Methuen Township Council have been striving for years to have the school demolished but due to the fact it belonged to an estate, of which no one was in authority to give permission, nothing was done.

In January this year it was sold for taxes and now in February the old school will soon be no
