The Institute was not all work, we had the social side as well. As we look through the book of 1912 to 1917 we see the following items.

A resolution be sent to London convention, - That the government prohibit the waste of grain by breweries and distilleries at a time when the people are called upon to economize on account of the shortage of food.

May 6-1912 Some selections on the gramophone added variety to the program.

June 1912 Visiting speakers were Miss M. McMurchie of Harrison she spoke on labor saving. Mrs Arkell of Teeswater spoke on Home Life and Miss M. McKague gave some useful ideas to our Institute. There were 70 present.

Feb 1913 Had oyster supper and had husbands and friends present

Feb 1914 Held oyster supper.

Jan 1915 Ordered 4 gal's of oysters from the store and 4 pies and cake from each member for supper, program to be patriotic.

July 7 1915 A lawn social held at Harry Mitcalfe's to raise money for patriotic purposes.

Oct 1915 October meeting held at Mrs Bremner, visiting us were the ladies of Teeswater W.I. who took charge of the program and gave a demonstration on how to make cod fish balls. also one on the art of Raffia work for the home.

November Plans were made for the making of quilts to relieve the needy in the city, these were sent to Fred Victor Mission.
