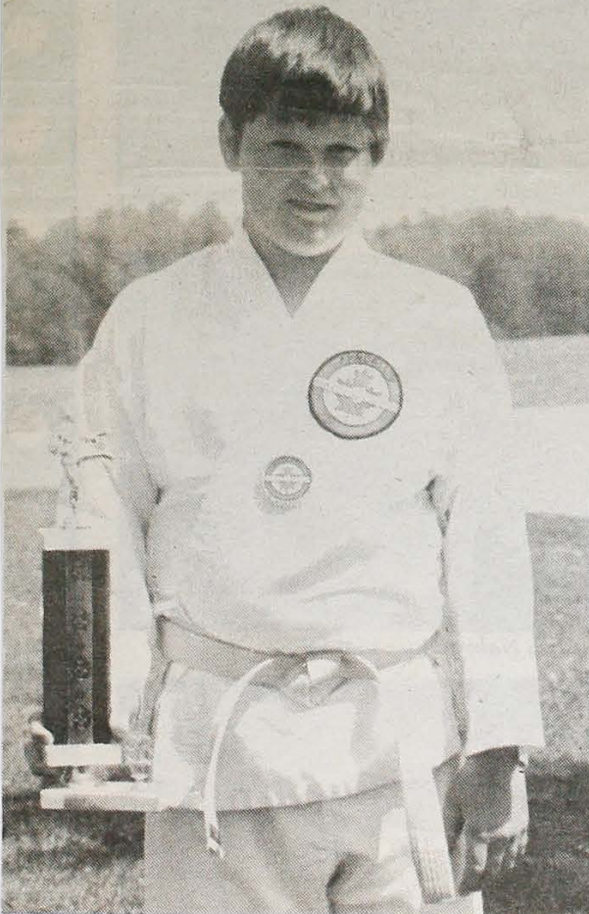
'92-'93 Festival year will be held Monday, June 7, following the Chamber of Commerce meeting at 9 p.m. Final financial tally
