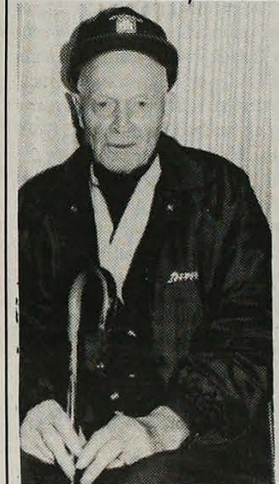
Al Dickson of Lewis Flowers in Wingham and formerly of Belmore held an Open House
