SS #14 pupils hold reunion 1996

On June 30, 1996, S.S. No. 14 school Kincardine Township held a reunion for former students with 80 people attending.

Pupils and teachers came back from Elora, Holyrood, Goderich, Port Elgin, Kitchener, Georgetown, Blyth and surrounding area.

An enjoyable afternoon was held reminiscing, looking at pictures, socializing and ending with a fantastic pot luck supper.

S.S. No. 14 school was built in 1888 and closed in 1966. At that time pupils were transported to Bervie school until the new Kincardine Twp. Tiverton Public School was opened on Jan. 3, 1967.

Looking back at the records of the school, S.S. No. 14 was built in 1888 and the brick cost \$122.00. Interest on the note was 58¢ per cent. School desks cost \$58.00. The total recorded cost of the school and equipment was \$1,206.77.

The property is now owned by Burton Hodgins Jr. The school was

taken down and a large storage shed was built on the school site.
