

Lord and Lady Tweedsmuir

Lord Tweedsmuir was born in Scotland August 23rd 1875. The son of Rev. John Buchan.

He spent his summers with his mother's parents near Tweed, and enjoyed the life of the Border sheep-herds and fishing and long walks. In winter he spent the long evenings with books. His father's people were lawyers and in 1901 he was called to the Bar.

From 1927 to 1935 he was a member of the British House of Commons for Scottish Universities.

In 1935 he was titled Baron Tweedsmuir. He became Governor-General of Canada in 1935 to 1940. He died Feb. 11th 1940.

Lord Tweedsmuir was a creatonologist and Historian and the author of many biographies including his own "Memory Hold-the-Door".

Lady Tweedsmuir - Susan Grosvenor was married to John Buchan July 1907. She also was a writer and has written many plays and books for children.

She was an ardent W. I. member in England, and was made Honorary Life member of F. W. I. O.

She started the W. I. organization across Canada to begin histories of their communities and villages.

After her husband's death in 1940 she returned to England where she made her home.
